
Setting the Date and Time **NOTE:** The system must be disarmed before date/time can be set.

- 4 "Discovering Control Panel..." is displayed.
- 5. Within 10-20 seconds the Device will display the Security Screen or the Dashboard screen if Total Connect Services are enabled.
- 6. The control will display ID information for your Mobile Device.
- 7. Select the """ to return to the Master User Screen.
- 8. A Security Screen is displayed on your Mobile Device, which can now be used to locally control your system.

Entry/Exit Delays

- Entry Delays give you time to disarm the system when enter through the designated entrance door.
- You must disarm the system before the entry delay period er or an alarm will occur (keypad beeps during the entry de period, reminding you to disarm the system).
- Exit delay gives you time after arming the system to le through the designated exit door(s) without setting off an ala If programmed, a slow beeping will sound during the exit de period until the last 10 seconds, which then changes to beeping (alerting you to the end of exit delay). If you can leave within this delay time period, you should stop, disarm system, and start over to avoid a false alarm. See your insta for your delay times.
